University of Oklahoma School of Community Medicine - Tulsa

The OU Tulsa psychiatry residency is a small, community-based program, where residents rotate at the major hospitals in Tulsa and receive training and supervision from university and volunteer faculty. This combination provides residents with exposure to a wide range of psychiatric conditions and patient populations. Our program aims are situated within those of the OU-TU School of Community Medicine, focusing on training physicians to utilize knowledge of social determinants of health, positively impacting the health of the greater Tulsa area, reducing healthcare disparities, and contributing to a more just society. We aim to accomplish these goals by training our residents in community-integrated sites, emphasizing psychiatry's focus on the intersection between medical/biological and psychosocial factors that lead to illness and impairment. We aim to train graduates who are prepared to obtain board certification in general psychiatry, as well as immediately begin clinical practice in our community, but who may pursue subspecialty training or careers in academic medicine. The program also aims to provide residents with an appreciation for the importance of physician well-being, so as to be advocates toward achieving the quadruple aim in healthcare.
