TAMC is the largest Army medical treatment facility in the entire Pacific Basin. Tripler's service region includes Hawaii, Japan, Johnston Atoll, Guam, Eniwetok, Kwajalein, various Pacific Island Nations and American Samoa. More than 400,000 people are eligible to receive care at the Pacific Regional Medical Command's premier teaching medical center. This includes active duty Service Members of all branches of service; their eligible families; military-eligible retirees and their families; eligible veterans; and many Pacific Island Nation residents. Tripler has 229 licensed hospital beds. Residents receive a broad supervised clinical experience in the practice of contemporary psychiatry, as well as structured teaching. Individual supervision, didactic seminars, rounds and case conferences are the primary techniques used to convey knowledge, clinical skills and the professional attitudes appropriate for a psychiatrist. The affiliated hospitals and community health centers are selected to provide the optimal clinical training program for our residents. In addition our residents have participated in research and leadership positions on both a local and national level.
