

## **Morehouse School of Medicine Residency Program**

The Morehouse School of Medicine Residency Program provides excellent clinical training as well as opportunities to develop as an educator, advocate and researcher. It is our goal to provide a comprehensive clinical psychiatric training experience with an emphasis on the biopsychosocial model, community psychiatry, service to underserved populations, and scholarly activities. Morehouse School of Medicine offers diverse clinical training sites, including at Georgia Regional (a free standing psychiatric hospital), Grady Memorial Hospital (the largest community hospital in the state) and the Atlanta VA Medical Center. Residents begin outpatient psychotherapy training in their second year, concurrent with an community outpatient psychopharmacology clinic experience. Residents have supervision in group, cognitive behavioral and psychodynamic psychotherapy. This experience is complemented by rotations in consult-liason, emergency psychiatry, addictions, forensics and child-adolescent psychiatry. We have a wide variety of electives available, including in child, medication assisted opiate addiction treatment, women's mental health, research, DBT, assertive community treatment (ACT), student health, sleep medicine and pain psychology. We work closely with our Child & Adolescent Fellowship program to ensure all our residents have robust training in treating patients of all ages. Within the psychiatry residency program, we have a specialty research track as well as many opportunities to pursue special interests in psychotherapy, public health, and advocacy. We strongly encourage community engagement, leadership and scholarship.
