

St Luke's University Health Network Department of Psychiatry Anderson Campus offers a general training program designed to prepare residents for the broad practice of psychiatry. The four-year, ACGME-accredited program accepts six qualified residents each year. Individual clinical supervision is emphasized to enhance education and clinical acumen. Rotations are carefully coordinated between St Luke's Sacred Heart, Kids Peace and Penn Foundation.

Our resident psychiatrists enjoy a balanced exposure to psychotherapy and psychopharmacology through a variety of subspecialty rotations. Clinical experiences include: consultation & liaison, substance use disorders, extended acute care inpatient treatment, partial hospital programming, geriatric psychiatry, emergency psychiatry, and child/adolescent psychiatry. Our psychiatric primary clinical site offers electroconvulsive therapy as a treatment modality, rotations on a medical detox unit, transcranial magnetic stimulation (TMS).

Psychoanalytic education begins early and then increases as a PGY 3 with a longitudinal psychodynamic case conference where residents enjoy the opportunity to formulate and present their own cases for psychoanalytic interpretation during didactics, receiving feedback and input from both resident peers and faculty. These features, combined with St Luke's friendly and flexible atmosphere, enable residents to create a personalized curriculum that reflects their individual interests.
