Enrico Castillo, M.D., M.S., is an associate professor and the Associate Vice Chair for Justice, Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion at the University of California – Los Angeles (UCLA) Department of Psychiatry and Biobehavioral Sciences. He is a faculty

He is also an associate editor for Academic Psychiatry, column editor for Research, Community, and Services Partnerships for the journal Psychiatric Services, and editorial board member of Community Mental Health Journal.
