Our fully accredited psychiatry residency program combines university and community resources to train psychiatric physicians. The program is a joint effort between Charleston Area Medical Center and West Virginia University Charleston Division. This arrangement offers a diverse patient population and the opportunity to train in a tertiary center, which also functions as a community hospital. We offer training in general psychiatry (4 years), and combined internal medicine/psychiatry (5 years). The affiliation of the Charleston Area Medical Center and the West Virginia University School of Medicine gives you the opportunity to train in a setting that has the advantages of an academic medical center blended with the diverse patient population of a large community hospital. One-third of WVU medical students complete their clinical rotations at Charleston Area Medical Center. In addition to working with and teaching medical students, you will share the training experience with residents from other fully accredited residencies at CAMC, interns from our fully accredited clinical psychology internship, as well as social work interns, nursing students, and other health sciences students.
