Our program provides a comprehensive, clinically rich environment for you to learn. Rotations emphasize experiences in a variety of settings that include the full range of patients with psychiatric disorders. You will learn under the supervision of our seasoned psychiatrists trained at some of the country's finest programs. Residents receive rich clinical education on rotations at our outpatient psychiatry clinics, UF Health Jacksonville hospital, and with our highly respected community partners: Baptist Medical Center, Wolfson Children's Hospital, Gateway Community Services (addiction services), Sulzbacher Center (a homeless shelter with a strong mental health treatment and a street psychiatry outreach program) and Renaissance Behavioral Health (a community mental health agency).

Areas of particular strength include child and adolescent psychiatry (with early exposure in the PGY-2 year), addiction psychiatry, and community psychiatry. Residents will graduate with a thorough knowledge of psychiatric assessment, differential diagnosis, biopsychosocial formulation and treatment planning (including psychopharmacology, assertive community treatment, and multiple forms of psychotherapy).

When you complete our training program, you will not only be an excellent psychopharmacologist, but also a psychiatrist well-rounded in psychosocial interventions such as cognitive-behavioral therapy, dialectical behavior therapy, family therapy and psychodynamic psychotherapy. Moreover, residents will have the opportunity to participate in clinical research and develop their own research ideas.
