Our psychiatry residency program has been in development since 2016 and received initial ACGME accreditation in 2017, and full accreditation in 2021. The Psychiatry Program joins several other residencies and fellowships at Cape Fear Valley Health including, IM, General Surgery, OB/GYN, EM, Podiatry, Cardiology, and a TRI year. Residents are actively involved in training and supervising medical students from Campbell, and schools in SC and VA.

The hospital and community are fully committed to training the next generation of physicians. Our psychiatry faculty are leaders in the hospital (including the CMO) and highly respected providing care across the spectrum including inpatient psychiatry, a busy ED crisis service, an always interesting C/L service, a newly formed med-psych service, a substance abuse treatment center, a community mental health center, and a vibrant outpatient service. Our residents also have clinical experiences in two nursing homes, a children's home, and Womack Army Medical Center.

Our hospital system combined has over 1 million patient encounters. Our patient population spans both urban and rural, indigent and affluent, patients from 2 to 102, and military and their dependents (Fort Bragg is the largest US Army base in the country), culturally diverse including a substantial international population.

We are a community program that provides one-on-one faculty supervision and support. We are committed to your training first and service needs second. We have NO OVERNIGHT call during your four years of training. Our faculty are motivated, dedicated, responsive to resident needs and provide exceptional training as they share their expertise. You will graduate from this program with robust clinical skills and with the ability to provide evidenced and outcome-based treatment.
