California Pacific Medical Center is the largest private academic health science center in Northern California and the flagship hospital of the non-profit Sutter Health System, one of the largest health networks in California. We offer a four-year general psychiatry residency program that provides outstanding psychiatric training in an innovative healthcare setting. We have a unique history: CPMC is a descendant of some of the oldest continuously operated historical hospitals in San Francisco, going back to the mid-19th Century. Our psychiatry residency program was founded in 1960 as an offshoot of Stanford University, after it constructed its current Palo Alto medical campus. A group of former Stanford physicians stayed behind to continue the mission of training physicians on the site of the historical campus, which was renamed Presbyterian Medical Center and is known today as California Pacific Medical Center. CPMC's Psychiatry Residency Training Program welcomes four residents per year, which allows for more individualized attention from enthusiastic and dedicated faculty, as well as training with a tightly-knit cohort of fellow residents and psychology interns. At the same time, we offer the advantages of working in a large, distinguished hospital system with multiple campuses around the richly complex and diverse urban setting of San Francisco. Our program has an established history of producing outstanding psychiatrists who are highly competitive candidates for clinical opportunities and fellowship programs around the country. CPMC is one of the primary teaching hospitals of the Dartmouth Geisel School of Medicine, and the majority of our core faculty have academic appointments with the Dartmouth Geisel Department of Psychiatry. The Department participates in the activities of the system-wide Sutter Mental Health Services team, the Sutter Neuroscience Research Consortium and the Sutter Program in Medicine and Human Values.
