H. Carrie Chen, MD, PhD is the Associate Dean for Medical Education Research and Scholarship and Professor of Health Systems Science at Kaiser Permanente Bernard J. Tyson School of Medicine. She also holds appointments as Adjunct Professor of Medicine at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences and Volunteer Professor of Pediatrics at the University of California San Francisco (UCSF). She completed her medical degree and pediatric residency at the UCSF School of Medicine where she was faculty for many years and held the Abraham Rudolph Chair in Pediatric Education before more recently serving as the Senior Associate Dean for Assessment and Educational Scholarship at Georgetown University School of Medicine. She received her Master of Science in Education from the University of Southern California Rossier School of Education and her Doctorate in Health Professions Education from Utrecht University in the Netherlands. Dr. Chen has developed curricula and assessment programs, provided leadership for, and disseminated on her work in medical student, resident, and fellow education as well as faculty development. Her research interests include workplace learning, workplace-based assessments including the use of entrustable professional activities (EPAs), and faculty skill development and support. She serves on the editorial board for Advances in Health Sciences Education, is a member of the International Competency-Based Health Professions Education Collaborators, and is faculty for the International Course on the Ins and Outs of Entrustable Professional Activities.
