Theadia LaRue Carey, is a native Detroiter. She has completed all her schooling in the city. She is a product of Detroit Public Schools, graduating from Mumford High School. Dr. Carey has two Bachelor

of Science degrees from Wayne State University (Biological Sciences and Psychology). She also has a Doctor of Medicine and Master of Science in Psychiatry and Behavioral Neurosciences degrees from Wayne State University School of Medicine. Dr. Carey completed her post-graduate training in Psychiatry and Addiction Psychiatry at the University of Michigan Health System. Dr. Carey is board certified in general psychiatry and addiction psychiatry by the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology (ABPN), also Addiction Medicine certified by the American Board of Preventative Medicine (ABPM).

Since 2015, Dr. Carey is a Community Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine in East Lansing, Michigan. In the same year, she became Psychiatry Residency Program Director at Detroit Wayne County Authority Health General Medical Education (GME), a Teaching Center which also known as Authority Health – GME. Dr. Carey's goal is for the Authority Health training program to be the standard for psychiatry training in community settings. Clinically, Dr. Carey is Associate Chief Medical Officer of Behavioral Health for Michigan Department of Corrections. Her main duties are to ensure that prisoners receive evidence-based care consistent with community standards for psychiatric disorders including substance use disorders. Finally, Dr. Theadia L. Carey provides clinical care at a small private practice where she provides evaluation and management of treatment resistant depression with Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation (TMS).

Dr. Theadia Carey is committed to educating the next generation of mental health professionals. She contributes to the education of medical students, resident physicians, social work interns, nurse practitioners and psychology fellows at multiple institutions.
